Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

While we are remembering the 1700th anniversary of the Nicene Creed this year it is interesting to note that the creed we know today as the Nicene Creed was not completed in 325 A.D. Another ecumenical council was called in 381 A.D. in the city of Constantinople by the emperor Theodosius I. This council was called to address the continuing problem of Arianism in which the full divinity of Christ was denied, but also to expand the Nicene Creed to recognize the divinity of the Holy Spirit. In fact, the full title of the Nicene Creed is actually the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed which is quite a mouthful to say which is why we know it more commonly as the Nicene Creed.

On the 8th of this month we will be celebrating Pentecost in which we recall the pouring out of the Holy Spirit upon the Church in tongues of fire and the speaking of different languages. The third article of both the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed is (continued on page 2)

devoted to the presence and ministry of the Holy Spirit. We confess that the Holy Spirit is the Lord and giver of life. The Holy Spirit is therefore also God along with the Father and the Son, and all life has its origin in him along with the Father and the Son. He proceeds from the Father and the Son. He is the personification of the love that is shared between the Father and the Son. The Spirit calls and gathers the Church by the Gospel and breathes into Christians faith and love in Jesus Christ. The Spirit has spoken through the prophets, inspires the scriptures to be written, enlightens our minds to love the scriptures and to respond in faith to the call of Jesus Christ.

The Holy Spirit gathers the Church as a community of the faithful and is given to us in our baptism. He purifies the communion of saints, and at the end of all things raises us from the dead.

If we are asked who is the first missionary, we might answer by saying Philip or the Apostle Paul. In fact, the first missionary is God the Father. He sends his Son into the world to take on flesh and redeem our lives from the dead. The Father and the Son then send the Holy Spirit into the world to call disciples together as the Church and empower us to live as followers of Jesus. It will be the same Holy Spirit who will bring us into full communion with the Father and the Son and enable us to behold the face of God and dwell forever in the divine life of the Holy Trinity.

Day of Pentecost

On 8 June the Church celebrates Pentecost and the beginning of the longest section of the Church year, the season after Pentecost. We will be in this season until 16 November.

On Pentecost we remember how the Church came into being, how it continues to live and what is the destination to which it is headed. On the first Sunday of Pentecost the disciples of Jesus were gathered in a single room praying and hearing the teaching of the Apostles. Suddenly the room was filled with a rushing wind, tongues of fire appeared over the disciples and they began speaking in other languages.

The disciples then entered the streets of Jerusalem testifying to the mighty acts of God in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Here we see that the Church is not the creation of man, but the work of the Holy Spirit in man. The Church continues today as the creation of the Holy Spirit.

The Small Catechism describes it this way: The Spirit calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies people from all nations to form the Church. He calls through the Gospel, gathers us in worship, teaches about Jesus, forgives our sin and begins in us the renewal of our nature to reflect that of Christ. At the end of all things, he raises us and all believers to full and eternal life in the divine life of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Holy Trinity

The triquetra or trinity knot is a symbol for the Holy Trinity that may have

originated as much as 5000 years ago. No one knows for sure when or where it originated, but it has been used for years to help explain the Trinity. It has three pointed ovals that are interlaced and form a triangle from point to point. There is also a circle that symbolizes eternal life. This familiar symbol was used by missionaries to explain the Trinity and Christianity.

Boniface of Mainz, Missionary to the Germans Commemoration Day June 5

"Boniface was born in the late seventh century in England. although he was educated, became a monk, and was ordained as a presbyter in England, he was inspired by the example of others to become a missionary. Upon receiving a papal commission in AD 719 to work in Germany, Boniface devoted himself to planning, organizing, and reforming churches and monasteries in Hesse, Thuringia, and Bavaria. After becoming an archbishop, Boniface was assigned to the See of Mainz in AD 743. Ten years later, he resigned his position to engage in mission work in the Netherlands. On June 5, 754, while awaiting a group of converts for confirmation, Boniface and his companions were murdered by a band of pagans. Boniface is known as the apostle and missionary to the Germans."



Cyril of Alexandria, Pastor and Confessor Commemoration Day June 27

"Cyril (ca. AD 376-444) became archbishop of Alexandria, Egypt, in AD 412. Throughout his career, he defended a number of orthodox doctrines, among them the teaching that Mary, the mother of Jesus, is 'rightly called and truly is the Mother of God' - *Theotokos*, 'the God-bearer' (Formula of Concord VIII 12). In AD 431 the Council of Ephesus affirmed this teaching that the Son of Mary is also true God. The

writings of Cyril on the doctrines of the Trinity and the person of Christ reveal him to be one of the most able theologians of his time. Cyril's Christology influenced subsequent Church councils and was a primary source for Lutheran confessional writings."



Irenaeus of Lyons, Pastor Commemoration Day June 28

"Irenaeus (ca. AD 130-200), believed to be a native of Smyrna (modern Izmir, Turkey), studied in Rome and later became pastor in Lyons, France. Around AD 177, while Irenaeus was away from Lyons, a fierce persecution of Christians led to the martyrdom of his bishop. Upon Irenaeus' return, he became bishop of Lyons. Among his most famous writings is a work condemning heresies, especially Gnosticism, which denied the goodness of creation. In opposition, Irenaeus confessed that God has redeemed His creation through the incarnation of the Son. Irenaeus also affirmed the teachings of the Scriptures handed down to and through him as being normative for the Church."

Highlights from St. John's Lutheran Church Council Meeting May 2025

The St. John Lutheran Church Council met on Thursday, May 15, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the church social room. Members present were Deron Steiner, Pastor Fleace, Barbara Prince, Tammy Wininger, and Duane Mann. Absent was Angie Steiner and Karen Mann.

Chairman Deron Steiner called the meeting to order. Pastor Fleace led in prayer.

The minutes from the March meeting were approved as printed in the St. John's Journal per a motion made by Duane Mann, seconded by Barbara Prince. The motion carried.

Treasurer Duane Mann presented the financial report for April. As of April 30, 2025, the report shows an ending balance of \$39,290.28. Duane noted that the money from the insurance has been paid for the recent storm damage. Barbara Prince moved to accept the report, seconded by Tammy Wininger. Motion carried.

Financial Trustee Report – Duane gave the financial report for Karen.


